Gao Ping's music often draws its inspiration from his native home of Sichuan in China, and *The Mountain* recalls the expressive and humorous melodic inflection of the local dialect. Slow and processional, *Questioning the Mountain* is a meditation written after the devastating earthquake which struck Sichuan province in 2008. *Twelve-Hour Bridge* refers to the vast distance between America and China, the structure of the piece symbolizing contrasting cultures, while the symbols '*Mei, Lan, Zhu, Ju*' are plants which stand for the beauty of different traditional Chinese character attributes.
